

Challenges

All students take part in an exciting academic Challenge - an opportunity to stretch themselves, collaborate with their classmates and put the theory they've learnt into practice.

Medicine students visit a local hospital to meet and diagnose real patients; Law students take part in a practical mock trial; Business students build and pitch an idea for an app-based business.


Whichever programme students choose, the Challenge is a powerful and memorable opportunity to bring the theory to life.



Masterclasses

Alongside class, Oxford Scholastica students join a variety of inspirational Masterclasses, which are designed to nurture practical life skills that will be useful in any career.

From debating to critical thinking, from leadership to university applications, our Masterclasses will prepare students to seize the future, no matter which subject they pursue. These are part of the programme - no sign-up required.



Hero Sessions

As part of the course, students will meet an inspirational Hero, a young professional who studied their subject and has gone on to achieve impressive feats in their early career.

The Hero will share their experiences at university and in their career, explain what a day in their life looks like, and leave plenty of time for questions. It's a chance for students to go beyond the curriculum and get real industry insight.

The International Boat Ball is a highlight of the programme - an unforgettable evening aboard a boat on the River Thames. Students also take part in a talent show, and plenty of movie nights, quiz nights and games nights with new friends.





Masterclasses are skills-based workshops students attend alongside their course of choice.


