

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**Gary Clark** (Music & Lyrics, Orchestrations & Arrangements) began his career in '80s band Danny Wilson, penning their hit "Mary's Prayer." He has worked with many artists including Natalie Imbruglia and Demi Lovato. He wrote/co-wrote the original songs for the *Sing Street* film, was executive music producer of Amazon's "Modern Love," and is composer for Emma Thompson's Nanny McPhee musical.



John Carney (Music & Lyrics) is an award-winning screenwriter and director. His credits include the hit Amazon Original series "Modern Love," Golden Globe-nominated Sing Street, Academy Award-nominated Begin Again, and Academy Award winner Once, which was also adapted for the stage, picking up eight Tony Awards including Best Musical.



**Rebecca Taichman** (Director) previously directed *Indecent* and *Mauritius* at The Huntington. She won Tony, Obie, and Outer Critics Circle Awards for her direction of *Indecent* by Paula Vogel, which began at Yale Rep/La Jolla/Vineyard before Broadway. 



# CALDERWOOD PAVILION EMERGENCY EVACUATION MAP




